I first met Azure in 2013 when I was selected from outside the university to be the new Raisbeck Endowed Dean of the Iowa State University College of Business. Azure was instrumental in helping us enhance the college's fundraising efforts. The year before Azure's arrival, the college secured about \$2 million in combined gifts and commitments. There are many ways she gives back to her community. Many of her efforts are connected with her children's activities, including the Boy Scouts and Johnston Schools. She is a member of the Can Do Cancer board, a wonderful organization helping central Iowans cope with the life challenges associated with breast cancer. She participates in a number of professional associations and considers herself to be a philanthropist. She was recently featured in *The Des Moines Register* (July 13, 2016), where she said she wants to feel passion, show compassion and help make a difference. For Azure, philanthropy is a way of life, a continuous desire to use her time, talent and treasure to make the world a better place.

She has found a career that allows her the privilege of connecting more people to a philanthropist's way of life.
