(B2B) Now in its 12th year, B2B attracts 1200 people annually for an afternoon of fun, food, prizes, with each and every students leaving with a backpack full of schools supplies and excitement about their return to school!

A review of Deidre's resume will reveal a young professional that has woven her personal passion for "lifting" people and addressing their individual and collective needs, into professional opportunities that not only tap into her vast skill set but also create opportunities for impact. In her current role as Manager of United Way of Central Iowa's Financial Capability Network, (FCN) and Coordinator for the African American Financial Capability Initiative, Deidre has developed and implemented a collaborative initiative that targets low-income individuals and families. FCN gives its clients access to mainstream financial systems & products while also increasing their financial management knowledge and skills. Under Deidre's leadership, FCN reaches over 20,000 people annually. And as if this weren't enough, Deidre is also an entrepreneur and principal in her own small business, Caleo Enterprises. Deidre started Caleo in 2008 and specializes in developing marketing plans for the small business sector. Caleo offers project development and

implementation services for non-profit organizations and businesses, particularly those needing access to hard to reach populations. Since its inception, Caleo Enterprises has impacted over 110 small businesses and non-profits including the Oakridge Neighborhood who has been a client since 2014.

Deidre's active engagement in the community is nothing short of amazing. She has a heart to serve and it has manifested itself in opportunities to use her vast talents and incredible energy to actively engage in the greater Des Moines community. From the B2B to the I Have a Dream Foundation; the Des Moines Branch of the NAACP to Mentor Iowa; the MLK Prayer Breakfast to the Young Professional Connection, Deidre is active, present and invested in the people, causes and efforts that are making a difference on multiple levels in the Des Moines Metro Area.

My admiration for and appreciation of Deidre DeJear is deeply rooted in the pride I feel as I watch her work her magic. I am in awe of her talent and inspired by her passion for engagement and her true desire to "be present" in the community that she and her husband Marvin call home. The recent launch of her campaign for Secretary of State makes her the first African American since Almo Hawkins in 1998, to run for state wide office.
