- her community and, specifically, the Vietnamese American Community in Iowa (VACI), with which she has been actively involved since 2006. Currently the vice president of this organization, Natalie has also helped Vietnamese refugee families by serving as an interpreter (especially vital for medical appointments and procedures!) and helping them file/apply for government documents such as green cards and citizenship tests. Natalie has also taught English and citizenship test classes.

Natalie Nguyen is an extraordinary young woman, one I am proud to call a friend. I have benefited from her positive influence and wise counsel and urge you to make her a member of the 2014 class of Forty Under 40. She is deserving of this honor!
