Over the last two years, I have had the pleasure of working with Shazia to bring increased access to mentoring, networking, financial services and leadership opportunities for hundreds of women worldwide. Shazia has served as a volunteer, mentor, generous donor and advocate of the World Council and our Global Women's Leadership Network.

Dedicating countless hours and significant financial support, Shazia has made – and continues to make – a difference in the lives of women both here in the United States and the 52 countries our initiative serves. In 2013, she traveled with the World Council to Bangkok where she met with leaders of the Asian Confederation of Credit Unions and developed strategies for advancing women's professional development and technology resources.
