He remains one of the most remembered district governors because he brought with him a wealth of Rotary knowledge and inspired others into action. Clubs in his district really became engaged in their respective communities.

Jim has touched many lives in a very positive way. His achievements outside of Rotary are significant. In every sense of the word, he is indeed a Sage. I urge you to honor this wonderful man appropriately.
